

There are some in the body of Christ today who are struggling in trying to please God. They are putting so much pressure on themselves to "be good" that they are tying themselves in knots. Each failure, each time they fall short of the mark, guilt, condemnation and shame pay them a visit and hinders their walk with God. Over time, they begin to feel better about themselves. until their next misstep occurs, at which point the terrible guilt-cycle starts all over again. To all who have been there or who are there today. God brings good news: our Heavenly Father finds no fault in you.

This is not to say that you are living a perfect life – far from it. But your right standing with the Father is not determined by what you do, but rather by what Jesus has already done. Jesus lived a sinless life on earth (Hebrews 4:15) and when He shed His blood and died on Calvary's cross He washed away forever the sins of those who believe in Him.

The writer of Hebrews, in speaking about the Old Testament system of animal sacrifice said, "For it is not possible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins" (Hebrews 10:4 NLT). He then went on to share the good news of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross by stating that believers "are made holy by the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all time. Under the old covenant, the priest stands and ministers before the altar day after day, offering

the same sacrifices again and again, which can never take away sins. But our High Priest offered himself to God as a single sacrifice for sins, good for all time. Then he sat down in the place of honor at God's right hand ... For by that one offering he forever made perfect those who are being made holy" (vv. 10-12, 14).

When Jesus offered His body and shed His blood at Calvary, He made a perfect sacrifice that took away our sins forever! This is why Paul joyfully declared, "if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold all things are become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17 KJV). Paul went on to say, "Now then we are ambassadors for Christ ... For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin that we might be made the righteousness of God in him" (vv. 20a-21).

In Christ we are righteous, which means in right standing with God or, as the New Living Translation puts it, "made right with God." This is entirely because of the sacrifice Jesus made for you and me over 2000 years ago. All we have to do is believe and accept Jesus' atoning work on the cross.

Consider this: over 2000 years ago Jesus stood before Pontius Pilate, who cross-examined Him to determine if He had committed any crime worthy of death. After peppering Jesus with questions, Pilate went to the angry mob and declared, "I find in Him no fault at all" (John 18:38). That's because, in

truth, there was and is no fault in Jesus! The Bible declares it again and again. And here's the good news: if you are *in* Christ Jesus, if you are in a living, vibrant relationship with Him, then when God looks at you, He finds no fault in you, too!

Oh, the Lord is working on you, all right, smoothing out your rough edges and repairing any blemishes, but He finds no fault in you because when He looks at you He sees you covered with the robe of righteousness through Christ (Isaiah 61:10). So even when you and I miss it, we can rejoice, because "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:1). Notice, the scripture does not say there will be no condemnation once you get your act together. It says there is no condemnation NOW!

So, beloved of God, keep following the leading of the Holy Spirit, who helps you live a life of glory according to the Word of God. Obey the Lord, not out of fear of being punished, but out of gratitude for His amazing grace and His wonderful gift of salvation through Christ Jesus. And remember, when the Father looks upon you, He sees His Son, Jesus. And just as the Father finds no fault in the Son, He also finds no fault in you. Every time you embrace this wonderful truth, lift up your hands wherever you are and give our God the glory!

Jesus Says

When we were kids, we used to play a game called "Simon Says." One of us would stand before the group as "Simon," and issue instructions that typically involved physical movements, like jumping up and down or touching your nose. The instructions were to be followed only if they were preceded by "Simon says." For example, "Simon says turn around." The object of the game was to trick or deceive the players into following an instruction that did not start with "Simon says." Whoever followed such an instruction was eliminated. Typically, "Simon" would rattle off instructions quickly: "Simon says do this. Simon says do this. Simon says do this. Do this." Whoever followed that last instruction was eliminated because "Simon" didn't issue it. As believers, we have the Holy Spirit living on the inside of us (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). One of the Spirit's functions is to guide us into all truth and He will instruct us only according to what He hears from Jesus (John 16:13). Throughout our day we will hear the Spirit leading: "Jesus say forgive him." "Jesus says call your mother." "Jesus says go to bed early tonight." In some ways, the Spirit is telling us, "Jesus says do this." Since the commandments of God are not burdensome (1 John 5:3), when we gladly obey the Spirit, things work out well. Yet in the midst of the instructions from the Holy Ghost, the devil will chime in with a "Do this." When he does, be careful not to follow that instruction because it may eliminate you from receiving God's best in that situation. Remember, each and every day, as children of God, we are to do only what Jesus says.
